

## Paper 2: Question 2

2. You need to refer to **source A** and **source B** for this question:

The experiences of the writers' in Africa are very different.

Use detail from **both** sources to write a summary of the differences.

### Step 1

- Read source A and underline approx 5 relevant quotations.
- Read source B and underline approx 5 relevant quotations.

(Write paragraph 1 on source A. Write paragraph 2 on source B but make comparisons with source A.)

### Writing Frame

In source A, the experience in Africa is 'luxurious' and many 'celebrities' have stayed there. People enjoy the surrounding area by traveling around in a 'jeep' with a pleasant driver sharing information about the 'wildlife.' However, in source B, the experience in Africa is different. They walk 'for miles' and they are 'alone.' They feel 'threatened' as they are faced with 'guns' so it contrasts the relaxing experience in source A.

## Paper 2: Question 3

You now need to refer **only** to source B. Henry Morton Stanley's description of the approaching Africans and the battle.

How does Stanley use language to convey a sense of threat and worry?

### Step 1

- Read source A and underline approx 5-8 relevant quotations.

### Follow this structure and remember to use quotations!

Paragraph 1: compare views and experiences

Paragraph 2: Are views shared in 1<sup>st</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> person? Are views shared in the form of a letter, article, diary entry?

Paragraph 3: Compare the language? descriptive, factual, statistics, evidence, dialogue, biased, unbiased

Paragraph 4: Compare the tone? serious, happy, amusing, sad

Paragraph 5: deserve support from councillors.
